In consequence of the variety and undescribability of the articles of property within the house at Monticello, and the difficulty of inventorying and appraising them separately and specifically, and it's utility, I dispense with having them inventoryed and appraised; and it is my will that my executors be not held to give any security for the administration of my estate. I appoint my grandson Thomas Jefferson Randolph my sole executor during his life, and after his death, I constitute executors my friends Nicholas P. Trist and Alexander Garrett joining to them my daughter Martha Randolph after the death of my son in law Thomas W. Randolph.

Lastly I revoke all former wills by me heretofore made; and in witness that this is my will, I have written the whole with my own hand on two pages, and have subscribed my name to each of them this 16th day of March one thousand eight hundred and twenty six.

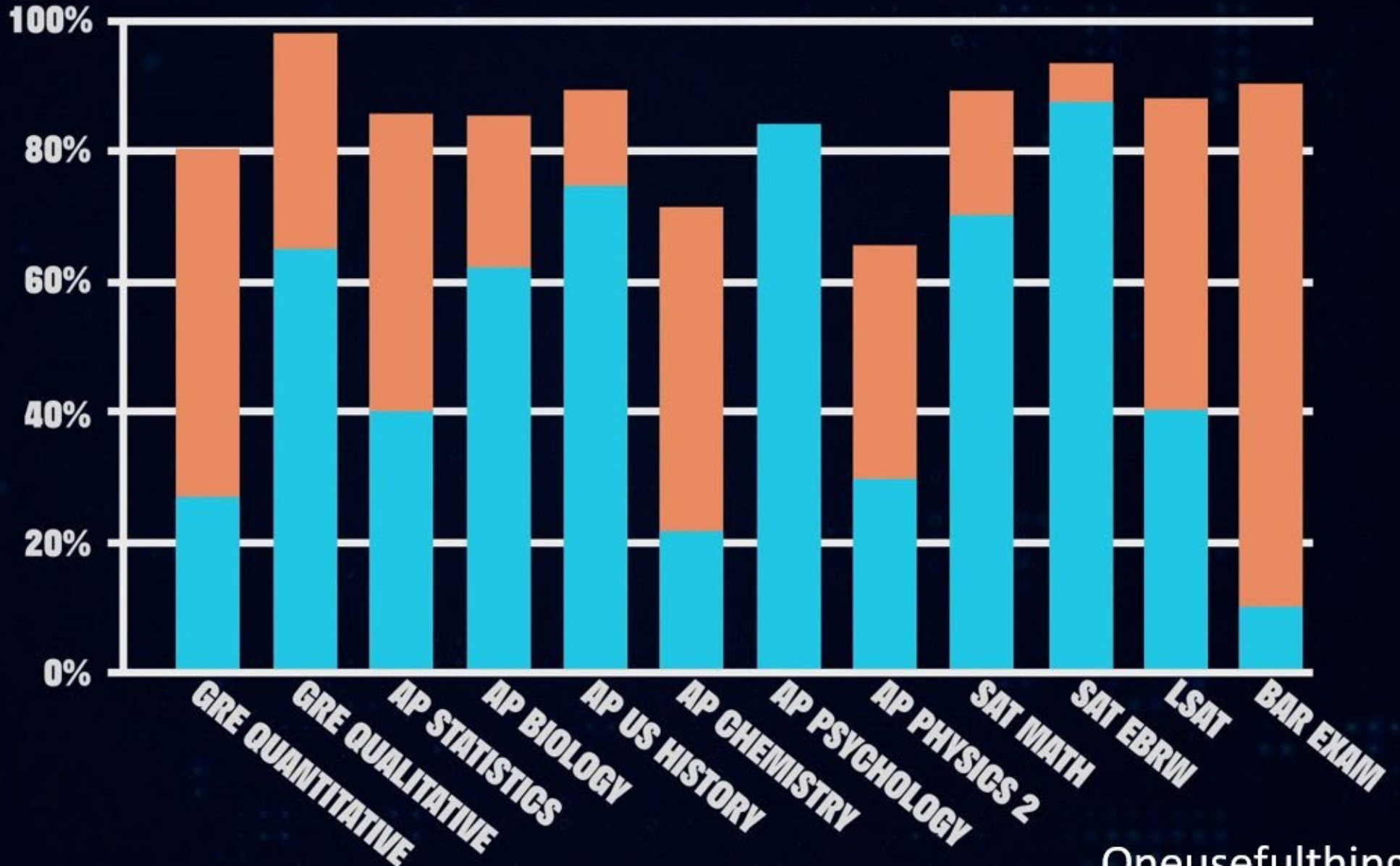

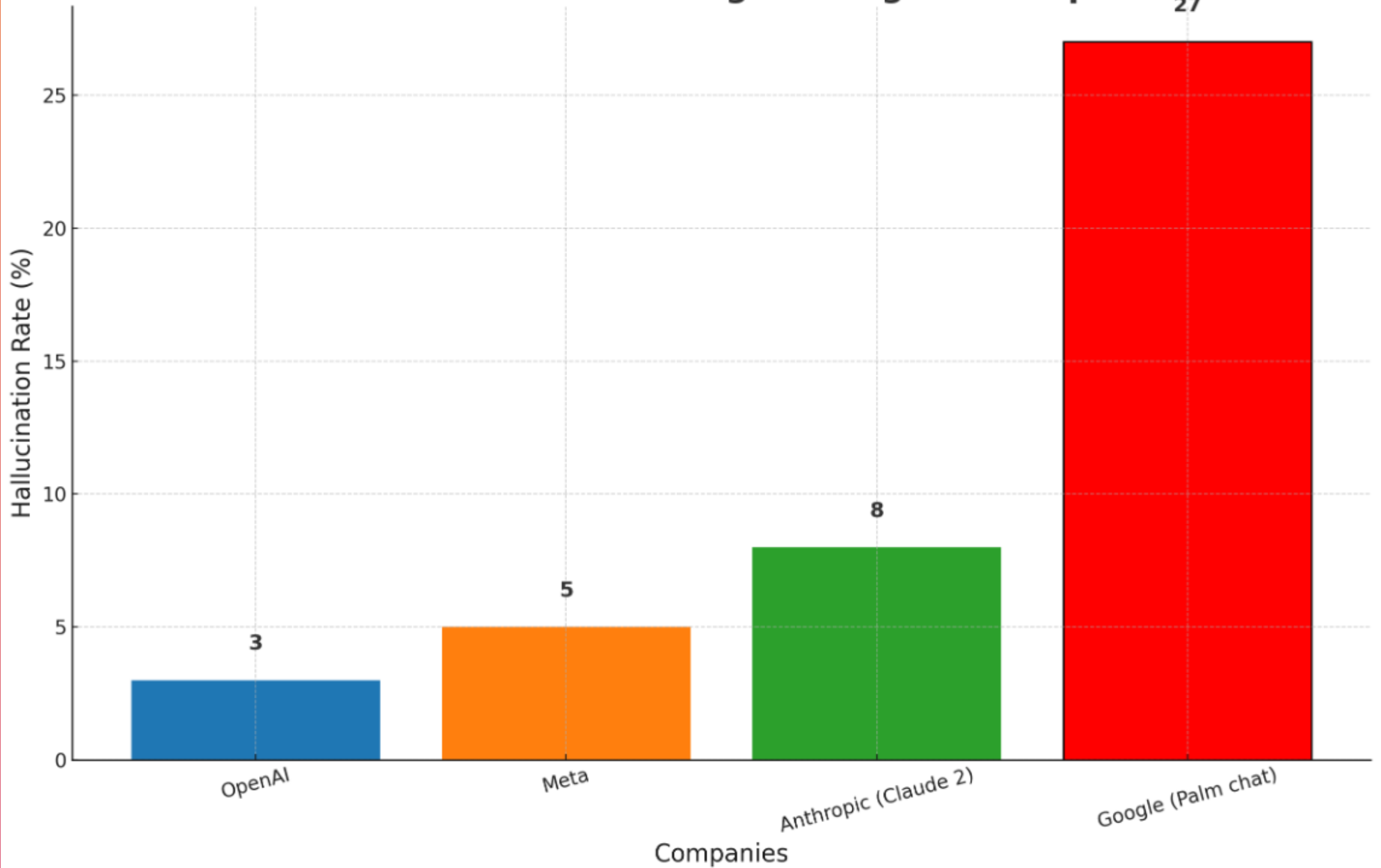
Limit: Nature and Consequences of LLMs

- NOT a search engine or “Google Killer”
- NOT a genie or magic research librarian
- Untethered to reality
- Poor at math (some better now)
- Poor at negation (some better now)
- Training data may be dated, biased, or stolen
- Input type (text, image, A/V) is limited
- Input and output size is limited


Avoiding Extremism:

The Use and Disclosure of AI in Genealogy

How to Write a Genealogy Prompt: A Role, a Goal, a Text, a Task, and a Flask

Prompt Template

A Role

Imagine you need an expert; what job do they have?

A Goal

Explicitly state your end goal.

A Text

Because we are doing fact-based work, supply the text that the AI will process.

A Task

Break-down the steps the AI should do.

A Flask

The shape the response should take: narrative, structured data, etc.

Example

You are an expert genealogist and experienced data scientist.

Your goal is to extract structured data from a provided obituary.

Find below the text from an obituary for John Smith in the July 20, 1923, New York Times, page 18.

Extract any explicitly stated relationship information; include a quote that supports that determination.

Format your response as a CSV file and display that in a code window for easy copy-and-paste.

An Introduction to AI Genealogy for Family Historians

How Should Genealogists Use Large Language Models in 2024?

- **Playfully!:** Play is the best way to learn, and a great way to get the 20+ hours of experience that seems to make all the difference for most people.
- **Administratively:** LLMs are great for many of the tedious aspects of work; these “dual-use” skills are very transferable; create more “genealogy time.”
- **Educationally:** LLMs are good as a general knowledge tutor, up to about the 10th grade level, for well-established facts (not cutting-edge research).



- **Excel Superpowers!:** For genetic genealogists, **spreadsheet prowess is your best bet for 2024**; ChatGPT will teach you at your pace on next-level skills.
- **Tech Support/Advisor:** Teach yourself Python, SQLite; answer tech questions.
- **Genealogically:** Use Steve’s five-point prompt (**role, goal, text, task, flask**) to do the basic transformations: **summarize, extract, generate, and translate.**

And, of course, always use these tools **Safely** and **Ethically**, by which I mean mindfully of **Privacy** settings (turn OFF "Chat History and Training" when appropriate) and **Use** and **Disclosure** concerns.

AI for Genealogy Writers and Editors: Drawing the Line

How Should Writers and Editors Use Large Language Models in 2024?

- **Reading/Researching (within limits):** Use summarization to read and learn more effectively and efficiently.
- **Pre-writing:** Brainstorming: topic generation; content expansion.
- **Writing:** THOUGHTFULLY; Contextually
- **Re-writing:** Proofreading for grammar, spelling, and other mechanics; Content review and critique, constructive feedback on clarity and cohesion; Transition checks.
- **Stylistic Superpowers!**: Determine the characteristics of your own voice as a linguist would describe it; know and use your own linguistic fingerprint.
- **Genealogically:** Use Steve's five-point prompt (**role, goal, text, task, flask**) to do the basic transformations: **summarize, extract, generate, and translate.**

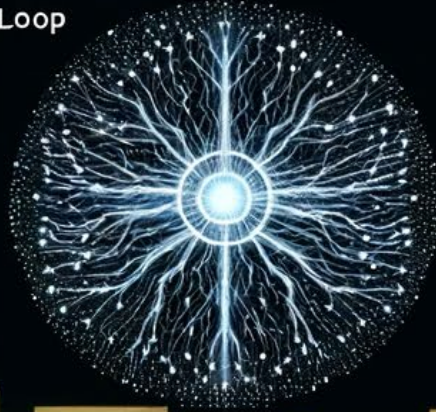

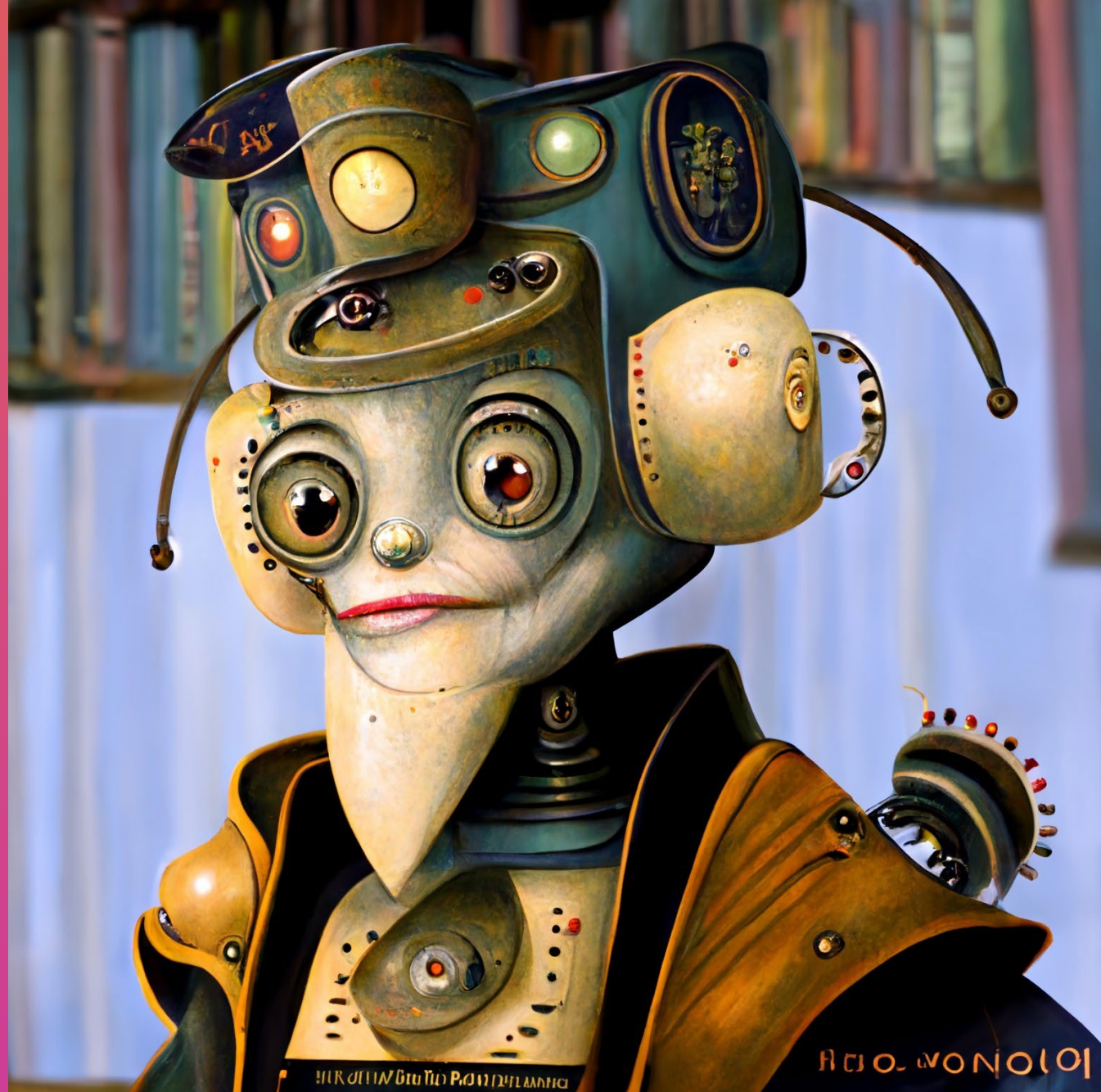

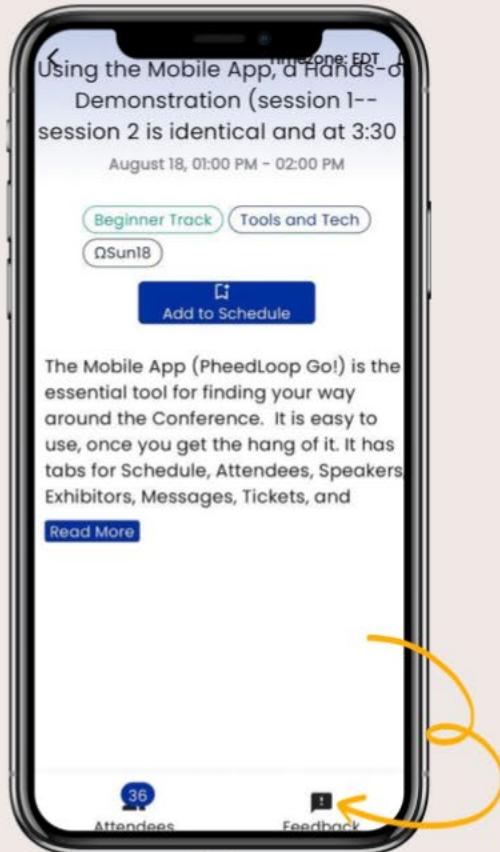
